**Syracuse Housing Authority: Bill Simmons,** *Executive Director* Mr. Simmons explained the Master plan for redeveloping properties in the urban core. This will be part of the i-81 opportunity; SHA looking to redevelop the 1,300 properties in the area in phases; mixed uses as well as mixed income. This will be a 10 year development, which is working towards deconcentrating poverty and creating construction jobs for residents in the neighborhood. Questions were asked in regards to any consideration of including residents in the planning, a process for encouraging & training current residents on how to, & opportunities for dislocated tenants on becoming homeowners, so they may have the qualifications for occupying the up and coming new homes being built. SHA donated to the September 14<sup>th</sup> cleanup on South Salina St near Taylor St.
