Meeting Minutes: April 10<sup>th</sup>, 2019

<u>March 13<sup>th</sup> meeting minutes</u>: Carl Sharak motioned to approve the minutes, Marilyn Madison 2<sup>nd</sup> all were in favor.

<u>Public Officials</u>: Lt. Izzo provided a crime report for the area; questions were taken from the floor. County Legislature Miles Bottrill stated that the speed reader is now a permanent fixture. The County is working closely with the City to address the sewer and water issues. The burial rights for veterans and their immediate relatives has been waived. Councilor Bryn Lovejoy-Grinnell announced DPW secured trash can lids on Salina & Florence, and Valley & Cortland Place. Residences requested the Dorwin Speed Reader be restored, and Bruch pick up include street cleaning. Councilor Lovejoy-Grinnell stated that all the budget hearings are now on youtube. The Rezone project is set for this summer. The City is beginning a conversation on City-wide redistricting. The Syracuse Cougars were honored by the Council. DPW has released its list of 2019/2020 of streets and curbs that will be completely redone.

<u>Debra Lewis, Lead Program Coordinator, OCHD</u>: Ms. Lewis provided an overview of the type of interventions that the Onondaga County Health Department does in regards to elevated blood lead levels. The State has recently passed legislation to reduce the level of lead in childhood testing to 5mcg; which would trigger case management services. This will take effect later this year. Information was distributed on the table regarding the different programs related to issues from lead contaminates in housing environments. Questions were taken from the floor.

<u>Committee Updates</u>: The Planning Committee is currently looking into a project development at 127 E. Glen Ave.

<u>TNT City-wide Board Update</u>: Dee Klees stated that there was a City-wide TNT leadership meeting on March 28<sup>th</sup>.
