Introductions Commenced****March 19<sup>th</sup> 2019 meeting minutes:** Hilary Donahue motioned to approve the minutes, Michelle Aliyeva 2<sup>nd</sup>, all were in favor.**Issue for City Departments/Elected Officials/District Representatives:** Captain Sobiech explained the restructuring of the Police Department under Chief Buckner. Frank Cetera stated that a request for additional stop signs on street corners with long blocks has been requested for over two years.**Debra Lewis, Lead Program Coordinator, OCHD:** Ms. Lewis provided an overview of the type of interventions that the Onondaga County Health Department does in regards to elevated blood lead levels. The State has recently passed legislation to reduce the level of lead in childhood testing to 5mcg; which would trigger case management services. This will take effect later this year. Information was distributed on the table regarding the different programs related to issues from lead contaminates in housing environments. Questions were taken from the floor.**TNT City-wide Board Update:** Frank Cetera stated that there was a City-wide TNT leadership training meeting on March 28<sup>th</sup>; the meeting was set up as a mock meeting and the food was provided by the Gifford Foundation. Pete Headd attended the last board meeting to discuss programs for caring for the elderly who are living in their own homes. Tina Zagya stated that the CNY Community Foundation has graciously provided funding for meeting snacks in the amount of \$375 for the year (April 1, 2019 through April 1, 2020). TNT has also received a grant from the CNYCF to produce PSA videos that will inform the community about TNT and the TNT lead awareness and education initiative.**TNT City-wide Board Nominations:** Frank Cetera explained the roles and responsibilities for the board of directors. Tina Zagya explained the board restructuring and the board election ballot process. Robb Bucklin nominated Rick Destito. Kim Harvey nominated Robb Bucklin.
