Kenton Buckner, Chief of Police: Chief Buckner reviewed the Police redistricting into 3 zones and that Captains have been assigned to each zone and are in charge 24 hours a day. Captain Kavanagh is in charge of the North zone, Captain Sobiech is in charge of the Southwest zone and Captain Lynch is in charge of the Southeast zone. A community survey was distributed regarding the Police Policy for body worn cameras. Captain Trudell distributed a handout for the Police Department anonymous Tip Line.
