**<u>April 1, 2019 meeting minutes</u>**: Al Freeman motioned to approve the minutes, Jeffrey Morey 2<sup>nd</sup>. All were in favor.

**Issues for District Representatives/Elected Officials/City Departments:** Councilor Bryn Lovejoy-Grinnell stated that a City budget was passed today. Blake Carter, representative for Assemblyperson Pam Hunter, took questions from the floor. Captain Sobiech provided a brief update from the last meeting. Sg. Hillman and Sg. Patti distributed a handout regarding an anonymous tip line for any information.

<u>Save the Rain: Salina Green Streets Project</u>: Zach Monge provided a powerpoint presentation. The current conditions have high CSO (Combined Sewer Overflow), which is why it is a target area. Work will be from E. Colvin St (Beauchamp Library) to E. Newell St. which will capture 5.3 million gallons of storm water runoff. Questions were taken from the floor.

<u>Creekwalk Phase II Improvements, Russ Houck</u>: Mr. Houck stated that there will be a dedicated community meeting for the Creekwalk updates on June 1<sup>st</sup> at the Southwest Community Center. Questions were taken from the floor.

<u>Tick and Deer Management Advisory Group</u>: Kelly Wise provided an overview of the Advisory Committee. A survey was distributed. Deer culling will take place in certain places within the City; Public meeting will take place on May  $28^{th}$  from 6 – 8pm at Nottingham.

The City will be contacted to coordinate the UNSACC grant funds for the trash cans and planters on Salina St. and the Save the Rain Green Streets Project.
