## Crime and Housing issues on the Northside:

Chief of Police, Kenton Buckner & Commissioner of Neighborhood Business Development, Stephanie Pasquale: Issues were raised in regards to Officers mistreating residents who reported criminal activity. If you feel an Officer is not properly handling a situation, you can request to speak with a supervisor and be sure to report any issues. Discussion ensued regarding the amount of officers currently active, new officers soon to be graduating from the academy, recruiting all ethnicities for new officers, types of crimes committed in different zones (property, violent, etc.), use of cameras and their inability to prevent or deter crime but have value after the crime has been committed, corner stores and drug issues. Questions were taken from the floor. If you see something, say something; this can be anonymous. Commissioner Pasquale spoke to the code violations that have been issued to a few problematic corner stores as well as the new Bureau of Administrative Adjudication.
