October 28th, 2019 Minutes: Jerry Haas motioned to approve the minutes without reading them and accept as written, Maria Pence 2nd, all were in favor.

Facilitator Elections: Ballots were distributed to the voting members in attendance; 20 ballots were collected. Andrew Snider with 16 votes, Jessica Kempisty with 18 votes and Lisa Matthews with 18 votes were elected by majority vote.

Issues for Elected Officials/City Departments: Captain Fougner presented a crime analysis for the Eastwood neighborhood. E-serve, ability to submit a not-in progress complaint, you can use this program online and self-report which will yield a quicker response than calling the department and waiting for an officer. The link is available on the SPD website. Tele-serve is a newly launched program that acts similar to e-serve but through the phone. Tele-serve number is 315-442-5207. Questions were taken from the floor. Councilor Driscoll addressed the concerns over panhandlers in the middle of highly trafficked roads; the Mayors office is currently working on an ad campaign to address it.

Citizens Review Board, Ranette Releford: Ms. Releford, Administrator for the CRB, provided an overview of the organization. The CRB holds open public meeting the first Thursday of each month at 5:30pm in the Council Chambers where cases are reviewed; meetings are also livestreamed on youtube. Questions were taken from the floor.

Special Project Proposals: Due by January 31st. Story Trail described their project for Sunnycrest Park; the project has been approved by the Parks Department and the girlscouts and Payne Branch Library will be the caretakers of the project. Special Project proposals are due by January 31st.

TNT City-wide Update: Missy Zawacki stated that there will be a TNT city-wide dance party fundraiser on Saturday, February 8th from 4 – midnight at the Ukrainian home. \$10 at the door. All proceeds will go towards TNT city-wide initiatives.
