7:10 LT Abbott Syracuse City Police Dept. – Crime update for N. Side – Small increase in overall crime rate. Property crimes are about the same. Motor vehicle thefts have remained constant. More shots fired incidents have been reported due to the shot spotter. Dirt bikes and unauthorized motorcycles have been increasingly targeted.

7:23 Representative for Councilor Schultz – Update on Franciscan. Home Headquarters has grants and other programs available for N. Side residents. Check syr.gov for more information. Common council is reviewing Mayors proposed budget. Butternut Circle project is nearing completion.

7:32 Cory Driscoll-Dunham Chief Operating Officer Syracuse City – Sanitation Cart Update

96 Gallon carts will be distributed to city residents. This cart is following sanitation ordinance. This program will create a safer environment for city workers as well as a cleaner environment for residents. Containing trash in the cart will prevent trash from blowing all over the city. The cart process is semi-automated; it still requires a human laborer. Accommodations will be available from DPW. The program will be rolled out in two phases. Phase 1 begins in June. 20% of the city will be in phase one. Check the website for more information. Translators will be available for accommodation requests. DPW will replace or repair carts as needed.
