Meeting began at 6:31pm.

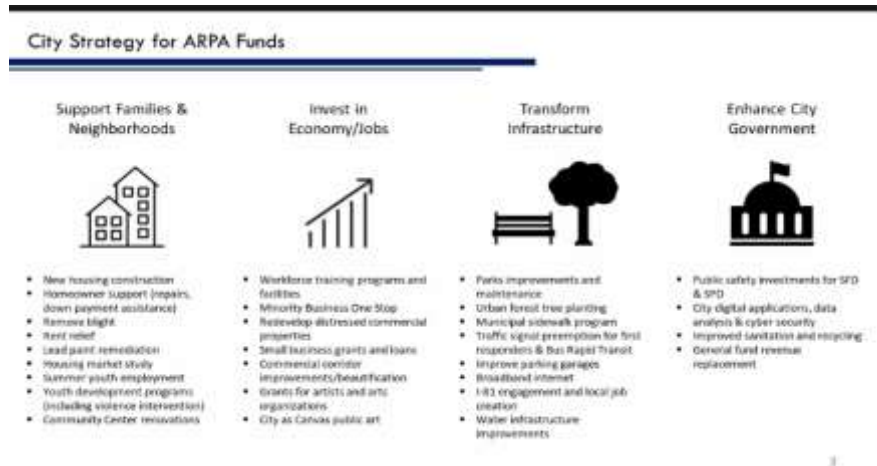
**February 8, 2022 meeting minutes:** Paul Harvey motioned to approve the minutes as written, Sharon Sherman seconded, all were in favor.
