Speaker: Corey Driscoll Dunham; Upcoming City Trash Bin Project

• City will provide 96- gallon carts to residents in two phases: 20% in Phase (1) starting June and the remaining 80% Phase (2) in September. 96 gallon is the only size available from the city and all trash must be contained within the bin. Each will have a bar code associated with the

resident's address. Recycling Carts will be rolled on in Early 2024 after the city see's how the

Trash Cart Test goes. You still call the Cityline to set up pick up for construction debris.

• Semi-Automated cart pickup allows a worker to roll a cart from the curb to the truck where the cart tipper lifts the cart into the truck. This increases safety by removing the burden of manual lifting and dumping that causes injuries. Speaker: Firefighter Tim Nelson: Fire Safety gave us his view on reporting issues with unhealthy neighbors or work being done in buildings within community that look unsafe. All can be a health or fire violations or cause for getting officials involved. Be Proactive!!

Burglary went down vs YAG

5 Year Average:

Crime is up 2%

Shots Fired in down 75%

Property Crime is up 15% (Keep cars locked up and valuables in- side home and out of sight.)

Cars Stolen is up 29% (Don't leave your car running in driveway or running into store or getting gas)

Violent Crime is up 1%
