TNT City-wide Board Director Election: A poll was conducted; Ed Morris was elected by majority vote.


<u>Crime and Safety on the Northside</u>: Mayor Ben Walsh, Chief of Police Kenton Buckner, Deputy Chief of Police Richard Trudell, SPD Captain Brian Fougnier

The Chief of Police and Mayor Walsh discussed the questions submitted in advance.

1) Do you remain committed to dividing the city into 3 sectors? What is the rationale given this sector has the most people and the most children? There are only a limited amount of officers and creating additional sectors will not impact the coverage. 2) It appears that certain crimes are on the increase in this particular neighborhood. How is that being addressed? Violent crime has risen throughout the country due to the pandemic. 3) Will some of the stimulus money be used to have a new police academy? There has been a new academy each year the Mayor has been in office. Last year was slightly delayed. There are low numbers of officers due to retirements. 4) Will Some of the stimulus money be used to address the mental health issues that exist in the city? The SPD is working with the County on increasing services and awareness. There is a meeting with Mental Health providers and Deputy Commissioner Parmelee from Children and Family services to begin those discussions. Helio Health has mental health and substance use services available 24/7, 365 days a year. 5) Summarize the police reform plan. Jimmy Oliver has recently been hired to lead the Police Athletic League (PAL); which will serve about 200 kids. Questions were taken from the floor.
