Issues for District Representatives/City Departments/Elected Officials: Captain Ralph Bowering, provided a crime report overview. Questions were taken from the floor. Bill Kinne, County Legislature, provided an update on the City-line Brook; Councilor Majok is currently in conversation with the City law department to get the proper easements to address the concerns of the community.

Syracuse Expeditionary Academy Charter School: Chaz-Lit Doyle

Syracuse Expeditionary Academy is seeking resident and business owner feedback about the proposed Charter School; which has been approved by the state. This will be a k-5 school, starting in the 24-25 school year. The Central Library will be the host site, RED HOUSE for the visual and performing arts programming, the downtown Y to host the physical exploration and sports and the MOST as the science lab. Questions were taken from the floor.

<u>Committee Updates</u>: Kathy Stribley, beautification committee, stated that TNT funded a sign for the sculpture in Meachem Park a few years back that has been awaiting installment due to the development along the creek near the sculpture. TNT is awainting a response from Julie LaFave, Parks Commissioner. April 23rd, Earth Day cleanup signup on OCRRA. FAHNN will be cleaning up around the Valley Plaza area and MAPA will be at the Cecile Center on April 23rd at 9am.

Board Nominations: Individuals seeking election to the Board shall live, own property, or work within the TNT sector for which they seek to serve. TNT Board members (2 per sector) serve a two-year term. Neal Capone nominated Joe Bennett, Lisa Lambert seconded. Joe Bennett nominated Lisa Lambert, Bill Kinne seconded, all were in favor.
